First time with this guide? Here's what you need to know.



It is your responsibility to ensure you are at the right location before entering private land. Consult a county or municipal landowner map to verify the location of the conservation site and double check that you are entering the correct property. You can also download Google map directions for each conservation site at www.albertadiscoverguide.com.

Cooperation and mutual respect between landowners and the public is crucial to the future of recreational opportunities on private land. Please act responsibly and obtain permission from private landowners for access. **Contact ACA for more information.**

Alberta Conservation Site Grid Map





Where Can You Hunt?

Alberta is split up into around 185 Wildlife Management Units or WMUs. Hunters are encouraged to pay attention to which WMU they will be hunting in as all sections provide different opportunities.

Plus, not knowing can lead to charges and possible jail time for poaching.

Biologists across the province are responsible for counting animals. Of course, this is a very simple way of explaining what they do; the job and information that comes out of it is much more complex. Different animals appear in different numbers in different places. There are a ton of elk in Suffield (WMU 148, 150) but not quite as many in other places so having the same number of licences available for everywhere in the province would either mean that we keep too many elk in Suffield or not enough elk everywhere else.

Navigating the system can be a little tricky, especially for first-time hunters. Once you've decided what you'd like to hunt, check the most recent hunting regulations for that species to learn about specific restrictions as well as potential opportunities in the various WMUs. For example: if you've decided to hunt game birds, special instructions might say "In WMU 410 the hunting of game birds is permitted only with bows and arrows or a falconry bird." After you've done all the research, you can apply for licences and draws (if necessary).

Be sure to ask permission to hunt on private land. 🏠



Peace Breaks Uplands

Site Details: This 180 acre site is located approximately 30 km northeast of Manning and consists of ungulate winter range and upland habitat. Several habitat enhancement clearings have been completed to improve vegetation forage and browse for ungulates. Wildlife found in the area includes white-tailed and mule deer, moose, black bear, grouse and a variety of small mammals and songbirds.

Restrictions: No open fires. Obtain permission from the landowner before crossing private land to access this site.

Partners: ACA, AEP

Bear River

Site Details: This 1,680 acre site is located approximately 22 km southeast of Fort Vermilion along Highway 88. Several habitat enhancement clearings have been completed to improve vegetation browse for ungulates. Wildlife found in the area includes white-tailed and mule deer, moose, elk, black bear, grouse and a variety of small mammals and songbirds.

Restrictions: Day use only. No open fires. Foot access only.

Blues Creek

Site Details: This 800 acre site is located approximately 58 km southwest of Fort Vermilion and consists of upland habitat. Several habitat enhancement clearings have been completed to improve forage and browse for ungulates. Wildlife found in the area includes elk, moose, white-tailed and mule deer, black bear, grouse and a variety of small mammals and songbirds.

Restrictions: No open fires. Obtain permission from the landowner before crossing private land to access this site.

Partners: ACA, AEP

Quarter Sections: NW-31-104-17-W5M, NW/NE/SW/SE-36-104-18-W5M



North Peace Uplands

Site Details: This 276 acre site is located approximately 100 km northeast of Manning and consists of upland habitat that is used as winter range by ungulates. Several habitat enhancement clearings have been completed to improve vegetation forage and browse for ungulates. Wildlife found in the area includes white-tailed and mule deer, moose, black bear, grouse and a variety of small mammals and songbirds.

Restrictions: Day use only. No open fires. Foot access only.

Partners: ACA, AEP

Quarter Sections: SW/SE-17-101-19-W5M



Whillans Flat

Site Details: This 108 acre site is located approximately 25 km northeast of Manning and consists of ungulate winter range, upland habitat and haylands. Wildlife found in the area includes white-tailed and mule deer, elk, moose, black bear, grouse and a variety of songbirds. The Notikewin River provides habitat for northern pike, walleye and Arctic grayling.

Restrictions: Day use only. No open fires. Obtain permission from the landowner before crossing private land to access this site.

North La Crete Uplands

Site Details: This 160 acre site is located 30 km southwest of Fort Vermilion and consists of ungulate winter range, upland and riparian habitat. Wildlife found in the area includes white-tailed and mule deer, moose, black bear, grouse, waterfowl and a variety of small mammals and songbirds.

Restrictions: Day use only. No open fires. Foot access only.

Partners: ACA, AEP

West Hotchkiss Uplands

Site Details: This 160 acre site is located approximately 20 km north of Manning and consists of upland and riparian habitat. Wildlife found in the area includes elk, moose, mule deer, black bear, grizzly bear, grouse and a variety of small mammals and songbirds.

Restrictions: Day use only. No open fires. Foot access only.

Partners: ACA, AEP

Quarter Sections: NW-16-093-23-W5M



Bushe River

Site Details: This 2,720 acre site is located 20 km southwest of High Level and consists of upland, riparian and wetland habitat. Wildlife found in the area includes moose, white-tailed and mule deer, black bear, grouse, waterfowl and a variety of small mammals and songbirds.

Restrictions: Day use only. No open fires. Foot access only.

Partners: ACA, AEP

Wilson Prairie Uplands

Site Details: This 314 acre site is located approximately 40 km southwest of Fort Vermilion and consists of upland, wetland and riparian habitat. Wildlife found in the area includes white-tailed and mule deer, moose, black bear, grouse, waterfowl and a variety of songbirds.

Restrictions: Day use only. No open fires. Foot access only.

Partners: ACA, AEP

Gravina Creek

Site Details: This 120 acre site is located approximately 45 km north of Manning and consists of ungulate winter range, upland and riparian habitat. Wildlife found in the area includes moose, white-tailed and mule deer, black bear, grouse and a variety of small mammals and songbirds.

Restrictions: Day use only. No open fires. Obtain permission from the landowner before crossing private land to access this site.


Tips

FROM REAL HUNTERS

- Use wind to your advantage – thinking about how your scent moves through the terrain can allow you to outmaneuver creatures with superior senses.
- When it's windy, reduce the number of arrows in your quiver (on your bow) – the wind moves your bow more if it has something to blow against.
- Never use your gun scope instead of binoculars – assume that when you're using your gun, you'll be pulling the trigger.
- Wear orange – it's not a legal requirement but we recommend it so other hunters won't confuse you with the animal they're hunting.
- Know the weather – for example: if there's a hard layer of snow, animals will hear you stalking them and you may want to use a blind instead.
- Know where you are – ask your grandpa to show you how to use an old-fashioned compass. Don't rely solely on your GPS as service can be spotty or batteries can die.
- Know what you're hunting – positively identify your game and make sure you have a lethal shot before pulling the trigger.
- Stay dry – be sure to wear waterproof clothing as well as a wicking layer next to your skin.
- Get permission to hunt on private land – otherwise it's trespassing.
- Move slowly – taking deliberate steps and stopping often decreases your noise and allows you to hear movement from your prey.
- Mentor others – when hunting gets as good as it can get for you, consider giving something back.
- Meet the landowner in person – landowners are (and should be) picky about who they allow on their property. Meeting you face-to-face helps the landowner get a feel for who you are.
- Know hunting regulations – they change depending on what WMU you are in.
- Let your wife shoot first – from the old adage: happy wife, happy life! 🏹

Know when the animals are active – dawn and dusk are the most active time for many species; you can use this to your advantage by sitting in a good spot and letting your quarry do the walking.

BE SAFE IN A PREDATOR'S HOME

Any animal that feels threatened by a human might attack but there are a couple that are more inclined, or, at least, will cause a lot of damage if they attack (a squirrel might have some harsh words but is unlikely to try to take down something hundreds of times its size). Bears and cougars are a little bigger though, and could do some major damage.

BEARS (black and grizzly)

Your best bet is to avoid an attack in the first place. Bears are interested in meeting humans about as much as you want to run into a bear. Make lots of noise and don't be out alone in bear country. If you should happen to see a bear, just move away slowly and try not to appear aggressive. If the bear does attack, use your bear spray. COUGARS

Like bears, cougars are not really interested in meeting humans. Especially if they seem big and loud; carry a walking stick and hike in groups to make yourself look bigger. If you should happen upon a cougar, wave your walking stick around, do not turn your back on it, stay calm and pick up any children (cougars are more likely to attack children). If a cougar does attack, fight back. Use whatever you can find: rocks, sticks, bare fists, fishing poles, backpacks, anything that you can because at this point, you are literally fighting for your life. 🐾



Sydorko

Site Details: This 160 acre site is located 17 km northeast of Whitelaw. Wildlife found in the area includes moose, elk, white-tailed and mule deer, black bear, grouse, waterfowl and a variety of songbirds.

Restrictions: Day use only. No open fires. Foot access only.

Partners: This is a DUC site.

Bad Heart River

Site Details: This 480 acre site is located approximately 23 km southeast of Wanham and consists of ungulate winter range, upland and riparian habitat. Wildlife found in the area includes white-tailed and mule deer, elk, moose, black bear, grouse, waterfowl and a variety of small mammals and songbirds.

Restrictions: No open fires. Obtain permission from the landowner before crossing private land to access this site.

Partners: ACA, AEP

Quarter Sections: NE-05-076-02-W6M, NW/SW-09-076-02-W6M



3 Eureka River West

Site Details: This 1,040 acre site is located approximately 20 km southwest of Worsley and consists of upland habitat. Wildlife found in the area includes white-tailed and mule deer, elk, moose, black bear, grouse and a variety of small mammals and songbirds.

Restrictions: Day use only. No open fires. Foot access only.

Partners: ACA, AEP

Quarter Sections: NW/NE-30-085-09-W6M, NW/NE/SW/SE-31-085-09-W6M, LSD 01 AND 08 OF SE-36-085-10-W6M



4 Bear Canyon Uplands

Site Details: This 320 acre site is located approximately 100 km west of Hines Creek, north of the Peace River, and consists of ungulate winter range, upland and riparian habitat. Wildlife found in the area includes white-tailed and mule deer, elk, moose, black bear, grouse, waterfowl and a variety of small mammals and songbirds.

Restrictions: Day use only. No open fires. Foot access only.

Partners: ACA, AEP

Quarter Sections: NW/NE-24-083-12-W6M



5 Lake Seventeen

Site Details: This 320 acre site is located approximately 10 km north of Whitelaw and consists of upland and wetland habitat. Several habitat enhancement clearings have been completed to improve vegetation forage and browse for ungulates. Wildlife found in the area includes moose, white-tailed and mule deer, black bear, waterfowl, grouse and a variety of small mammals and songbirds.

Restrictions: No open fires. Day use only. Obtain permission from the landowner before crossing private land to access this site.

Partners: ACA, AEP

Quarter Sections: NE-08-083-01-W6M, NW-17-083-01-W6M



6 Laternel/Simonette

Site Details: This 1,649 acre site is located approximately 30 km south of Debolt. The site is an important winter range for ungulates and consists of upland and riparian habitat. A prescribed burn has been completed to enhance vegetation forage and browse for ungulates. Wildlife found in the area includes elk, moose, white-tailed and mule deer, black bear, grizzly bear, grouse and a variety of small mammals and songbirds. The Simonette River supports Arctic grayling, northern pike and walleye.

Restrictions: Day use only. No open fires. Foot access only.

Partners: ACA, AEP

8 Whitetail North

Site Details: This 800 acre site is located 10 km northeast of Belloy and consists of wetland and upland habitat. Wildlife found in the area includes moose, elk, white-tailed and mule deer, black bear, grouse, waterfowl and a variety of songbirds.

Restrictions: Day use only. No open fires. Foot access only.

Partners: This is a DUC site.

Quarter Sections: NW/NE-12-079-02-W6M, SW/SE-13-079-02-W6M, SE-14-079-02-W6M



9 Oriole

Site Details: This 640 acre site is located approximately 16 km southwest of Fairview and consists of upland and wetland habitat. Wildlife found in the area includes moose, elk, white-tailed and mule deer, black bear, grouse, waterfowl and a variety of songbirds.

Restrictions: Day use only. No open fires. Foot access only.

Partners: This is a DUC site.

Quarter Sections: NW/NE/SW/SE-32-080-05-W6M



10 McLaughlin

Site Details: This 160 acre site is located 1 km south of Bezanson and consists of upland and wetland habitat. Wildlife found in the area includes moose, elk, white-tailed and mule deer, black bear, grouse, waterfowl and a variety of songbirds.

Restrictions: Day use only. No open fires. Foot access only.



All the poachers in this case were charged, all received hunting bans and a couple even did some hard time.

Not every crime is high-profile though. Report A Poacher receives thousands of calls every year resulting in tens of thousands of dollars rewarded to callers with information that results in a conviction. Hunting crimes include trespassing on private property, using a drone, hunting while impaired, or allowing your dog to chase big game. It's best to study the regulations before going out. 🏹

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



Many people take their big game to professionals for butchering. While this can often yield quality results, it costs money. It is much cheaper to butcher your own harvested game but there are a couple of things you should know.

SKINNING: If you can, hang the animal from its hind legs from a large tree. This way you have gravity working with you, which makes things a little easier. Skin the animal by pulling the skin down while lightly slicing it, starting at the top. Remember, it's always easier to skin a warm animal (which usually means freshly harvested; do not microwave).

TENDERIZE: Hang the animal in a colder environment (No warmer than 5°C, but above freezing) for a couple days to a week. The amount of time depends on the age of the animal. Remember that young animals means a shorter aging time (a couple days), and large animals can go for a week or more. This will age the meat and make it tender. If the weather is too warm, you can de-bone the meat and rack it in a spare refrigerator for the same duration.

CHUNKS: Leave the largest muscle groups intact, you can always cut or grind them up, but leaving them as roast-style chunks will keep all the meal options available to you.

TRIMMING: If you are patient and careful enough, it's always best to cut away all the tendons, sinew and fat before cutting the meat into roasts and steaks. It's impossible to get every teeny tiny morsel, but the more you trim away, the better flavour you will experience.

AGAINST THE GRAIN: If possible, cut against the muscle "grain" when cutting steaks. By cutting against the grain, you are breaking up long muscle fibers that are more difficult to chew.

EASY GRINDING: Planning to grind some meat into burger? Cut the meat into sizes that will fit in your grinder, put into a plastic bag and throw it in the freeze for 30 minutes or so. Partially frozen meat is much easier to grind and won't clog your grinder. 🏹


Lac Cardinal Point Uplands

Special Hunting Days

In an effort to introduce youth to hunting, Alberta has special hunting days. Waterfowler Heritage Days takes place on September 2 and 3, 2017 and a Youth Hunting Initiative mixed together with Provincial Hunting Day takes place on Saturday, September 23, 2017. The special days allow the new hunters to learn about proper hunting techniques, ethics and conservation.

Waterfowler Heritage Days allows youth age 12 to 17 the opportunity to hunt waterfowl without a Migratory Game Bird Hunting Permit or a provincial Game Bird Licence. Teenagers must first pass the Alberta Hunter Education course and be accompanied by an adult with a migratory game bird hunting permit. The adult may not bring a firearm or mentor more than two youth at a time. Regular bag limits and possession limits apply and hunters must be aware of the limits in the WMU (game bird hunting can only take place in a WMU where there is an open migratory game bird hunting season).

For the **Provincial Hunting Day**, hunting groups host events throughout Alberta and provide mentoring opportunities for first-time hunters. This takes place at the same time as the Youth Hunting Initiative where the same rules as Waterfowler Heritage Days apply except accompanying adults may also hunt upland game birds on this day.

One more thing: even though it's almost Thanksgiving, you can't hunt Merriam's turkey on these days. 🦃

Transporting YOUR GUN

There are three different classes of firearms in Alberta: non-restricted, restricted and prohibited. There are different rules regarding transporting firearms based on what class they fall into.

Non-restricted: Most shotguns and rifles fall into the non-restricted class of firearms and transporting them is pretty simple: they cannot be loaded (though, it's a good idea to use a trigger lock and gun case). If you need to leave your car unattended for any reason with a non-restricted firearm in it, be sure that it is locked in your trunk or, at least, out of sight of any passers-by.

Restricted: You'll need a special licence to carry a restricted firearm in Alberta. But if you have all your paperwork in order and need to transport it, unload the firearm, attach a secure locking device, lock the firearm in a sturdy, non-transparent container and remove the bolts or bolt carriers from any automatic firearms. You must also obtain an "authorization to transport."

Prohibited: The only way one can possess a prohibited firearm is to have been grandfathered in (having one registered to your name before it became prohibited). The rules for transport follow the same as the restricted firearm.

1 Blackstone-Wapiabi Elk Range

Site Details: This 4,397 acre site is located approximately 110 km west of Rocky Mountain House and is situated in the Blackstone-Wapiabi Forest Land Use Zone. The site is a wildlife enhancement area where mechanical clearing and prescribed burning have been conducted to improve ungulate winter range conditions. This location provides good hunting opportunities for elk in the Rocky Mountain Forest Reserve. In addition, other big game species found in this area include moose, white-tailed deer, mule deer and black bear. Upland game birds common to the area include ruffed grouse, spruce grouse and occasionally dusky grouse at higher elevations.

Restrictions: Refer to recreational access guidelines developed by AEP for the Blackstone-Wapiabi Forest Land Use Zone at www.AEP.alberta.ca.

Interpretive signage guides visitors through the regenerating forest, and pamphlets about the trail and a fire fact sheet can be found on-site and at AEP, Parks Canada and ACA offices. Wildlife found in the area includes elk, bear, sheep, deer, woodpeckers and a variety of small mammals and songbirds.

What **NOT** *to wear*

We all know when dressing for hunting that layers are a must. A thin, wicking layer next to your skin, a warm layer next, then an outer layer that blocks the wind and moisture—adaptability to the changing weather is imperative. We all know that cotton is not a good idea as it holds in moisture and can have you shivering in no time. And we all know that there are as many opinions on camouflage as there are patterns.

Also important when choosing hunting-wear is what is *not* there: **scent**, **noise** and **visibility**.

Scent-free There are a lot of specifically manufactured products you can wash your hunting clothes in to keep them scent-free though hand washing them with baking soda is often just as effective. Once washed, don't throw them in a dryer with a Downey vanilla-scented dryer sheet. Drying outside on a line should keep your clothes smelling outdoorsy.

Once your clothes are clean and dry, store them in resealable plastic bags and plastic storage containers. Try not to wear them on the day you're hunting (in a coffee shop, putting gas in your car) until you get to the site and then change outside to keep the new car smell off them too.

Noise-free Traditionally, wind-and waterproof-clothing makes a lot of noise. There are fabrics in the market that currently cut down on this noise, which you can find at your local hunting store. Before you go out, wear your clothing around the house to ensure its comfort and silence.

Sight-free There are so many opinions on the best camouflage. It really depends on the eyesight of the animal you're hunting and the season. While big game can see very few colours, waterfowl has pretty keen eyesight. However, big game is very sensitive to movement, so no matter what you're wearing, it often depends more on how still you can remain. 🦋



QUICK TIPS FOR DOG TRAINING

Patience and Obedience is Key

Nothing is more annoying than a hyperactive, restless dog while you are hiding in cover and waiting. The great majority of hunting is patience and silence, and your hunting dog needs to reflect that. Before great retrieving skills are taught, your dog needs to understand that not every gunshot or falling duck is cause for an excited retrieval. When teaching retrieval, also teach non-retrieval. Throw dummies and don't let the dog immediately get them—make the dog wait. Or to be more extreme, throw the dummies and collect them yourself.

Short Training Sessions

Conveniently, short training sessions are better for the dog and easier to fit into your schedule. Continually go back to the basics to reinforce simple behaviours, even if you think your dog has mostly gotten it, it always helps to continually build communication and trust between you and your dog. Don't force it too much either—if the lesson becomes frustrating, call it quits and try it again tomorrow.

Return to Hunter

One of the most common issues with dogs is their inability to come back on command. Many dogs get caught up in the excitement and for some it can take incessant calling to get your dog to return to you. This is also common among younger dogs. This is one of those basic commands that go along with sit and stay, but it is a really essential one that is difficult for some dogs. If you have mastered this command, the dog will return to you even in the face of very compelling dog-distractions such as prancing cats and smelly things that might be edible if you try hard enough. 🏠

Site Details: Police Outpost Lake is located in Police Outpost Provincial Park approximately 32 km south of Cardston. The lake is 98 ha in size, up 5.5 m (18 ft) deep. The fishery is managed as a quality stock fishery that allows harvest of one rainbow trout over 50 cm. Provincial campsites, day use areas and a boat launch are available in the park. The access road is closed at the park boundary November 1 – April 1. This lake is aerated during the winter through ACA's Lake Aeration Program.



Sulphur Lake - Lake Aeration



Finding the Right Footwear

You can find the same helpful information on hunting boots all over the internet. Basically, the kind of footwear you choose to hunt in largely depends on two different factors: weather and activity level (two for the functionality-over-style people; others know that fashion is a super-important third factor).

Changing seasons make for very different boot needs. While you probably don't need insulation and furry liners in August, in December these things would be hot commodities. And remember that the more material you have on your foot the less sneaky you're able to be, but as one hunting enthusiast wisely points out:

“ Sometimes you need to be more concerned with keeping your toes than being quiet. ”

Activity level also makes a difference. Support and traction should be big deciders for hiking on hilly terrain but are not as necessary for more sedentary hunts.

Other factors, perhaps not so widely thought of that you should consider are:

- Know what socks you'll be wearing to hunt. Wear those socks to the store to try on the boots so you can get the proper fit.
- There are different qualities of laces. Tripping over an untied lace can seriously impact the stalking of an animal. Laces with a bit of wax to make them sticky are always a good option.
- Know your feet—different brands make different widths.
- Research different boots online. Check the consumer reports and reviews (and take them with a grain of salt).
- Consider if you might need snake boots or scent-free boots or how waterproof you'll need your boots to be.
- Once you've bought the boots, wear them enough to know if they're the right fit. But wear them only indoors in case they're not; stores will only take back shoes that haven't been outside. 🐾



1 Cassills Marsh

Site Details: This 616 acre site is located approximately 19 km west of Brooks on Highway 542. The site is managed in conjunction with the Antelope Creek Ranch (F4/11). Site Details: Fincastle Reservoir introduces visitors to a different kind of neighbourhood—great blue

heron style. A rookery is located on a nearby island, home to generations of herons who have come, built nests and reared their young. The human-made nesting structure, built by ACA staff in 2000, holds some 12 heron nests and replaces the since-deteriorated poplar tree that was the population's former home. Bring your binoculars and observe the peculiar feeding and nesting habits of these great birds. Be respectful and keep your distance. Pack your fishing rod and try landing a walleye, northern pike or yellow perch. This 33 acre site is located approximately 10 km east of Taber. From Taber, travel east on Highway 3 for 9 km and then turn north and travel 0.5 km.

Wildlife surveys completed in 2010 and 2011 identified 65 species that enjoy the mix of native prairie uplands, ephemeral wetlands and cropland. Management activities focus on restoring cropland back to native grassland in order to benefit greater sage-grouse and other grassland species such as Sprague's pipit, sharp-tailed grouse and pronghorn antelope. Other wildlife observed here includes ferruginous hawks, deer, prairie rattlesnakes, badgers, pintails, mallards and various songbirds.

The remaining habitat primarily consists of tame grass hayland. There are also some draws with native grasses and shrubs. Wildlife found in the area includes pheasants, sharp-tailed grouse, partridge, deer, pronghorn antelope, and the occasional rattlesnake.

It is located approximately 15 km east of Medicine Hat along the Trans-Canada Highway. This purchase conserves native prairie and enhances habitat for game species, such as pronghorn, sharp-tailed grouse and ring-necked pheasant, and for species at risk, such as Sprague's pipit and northern leopard frog. Over 600 acres consist of native grass communities, and nearly 300 acres are comprised of a mix of riparian vegetation along Ross Creek, tame grasses and ephemeral wetlands. During wildlife inventories, 70 different species were observed, including eight species at risk.
