



HUNTER PERSPECTIVES ON PRIVATE LAND ACCESS

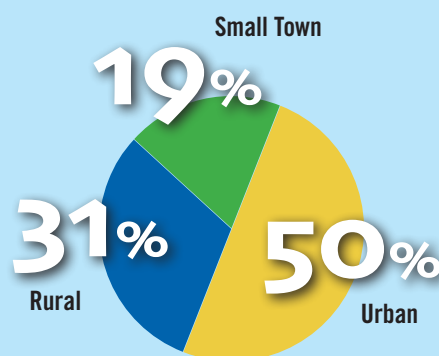
3,455 Hunters Participated

This voluntary, online survey was active from December 1, 2021 to January 5, 2022.

The questions were designed to mirror and complement those asked of landowners earlier in 2021. Partner organizations promoted survey participation to hunters through newsletters and social media posts. Alberta Conservation Association's social media accounts and electronic newsletter were also used to promote the survey to a significant portion of Alberta's licensed hunters. Online ads were used to reach hunters that we may not have the ability to communicate with directly.

Results represent the group of survey respondents who completed the online survey and may not hold true for the general population of hunters across the province.

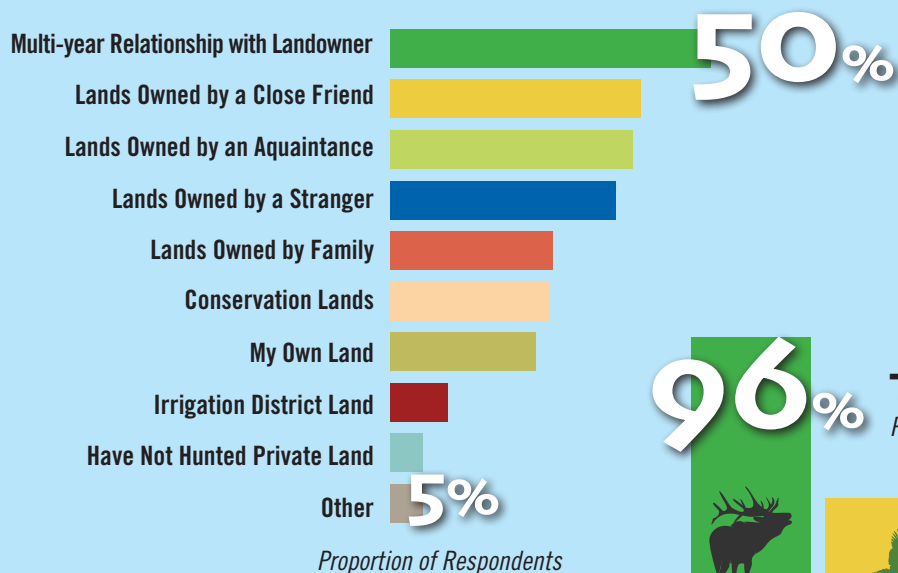

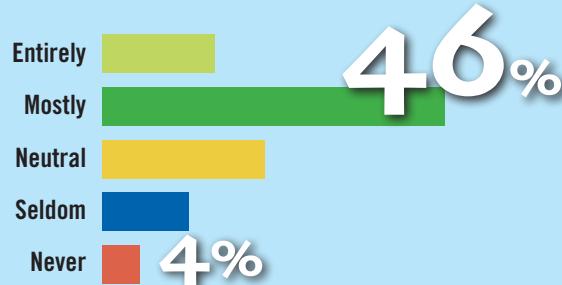


Types of Private Land Hunted

In past three years (2019, 2020, 2021).

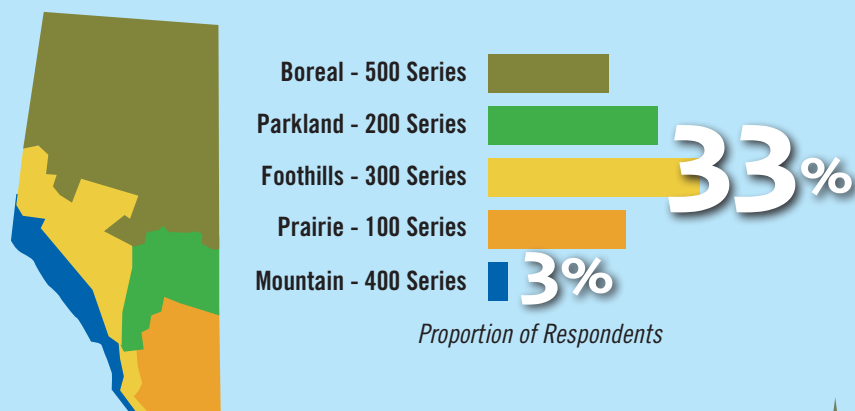


Reliance on Private Land Access

In past three years (2019, 2020, 2021).

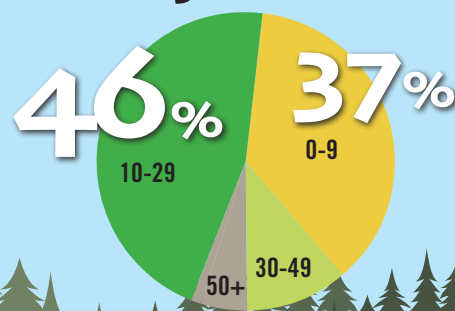


96% Type of Game Hunted

Proportion of Respondents

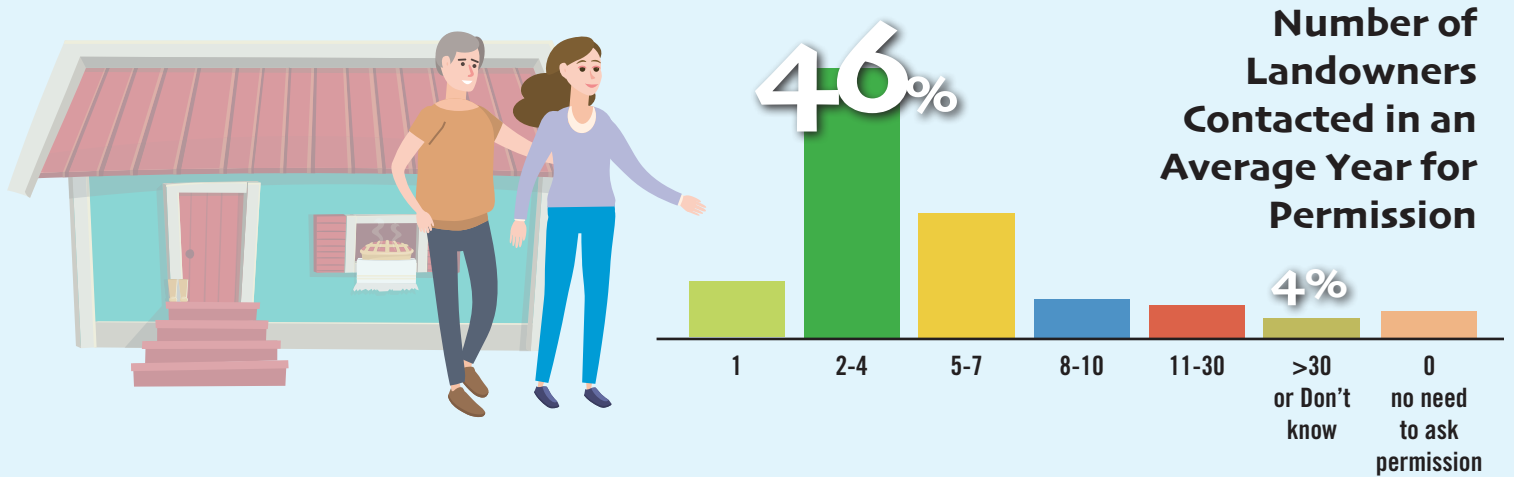


Days per Year Spent Hunting Private Land



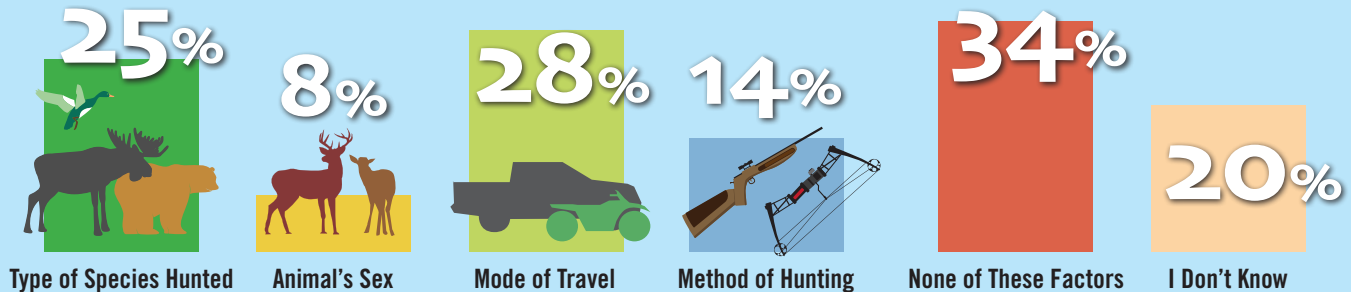
Methods of Contacting Landowners for Permission

Proportion of Respondents

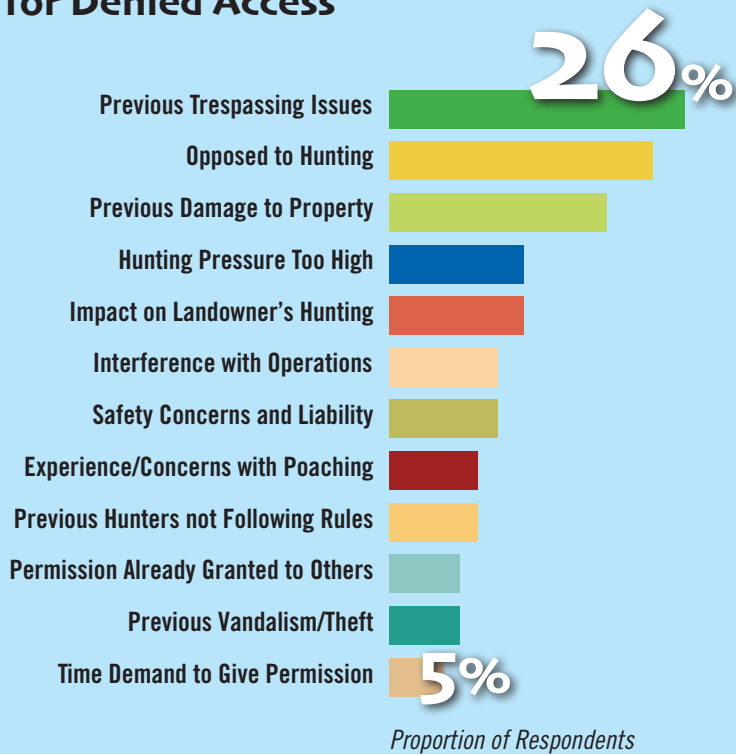


Factors Hunters Felt Influenced Landowner's Decisions on Access

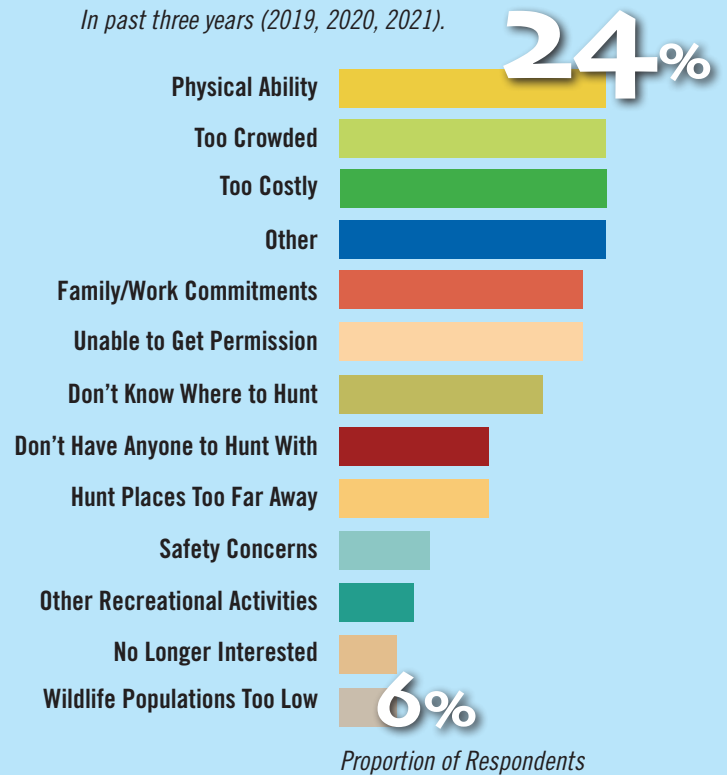


Reasons Given to Hunters for Denied Access

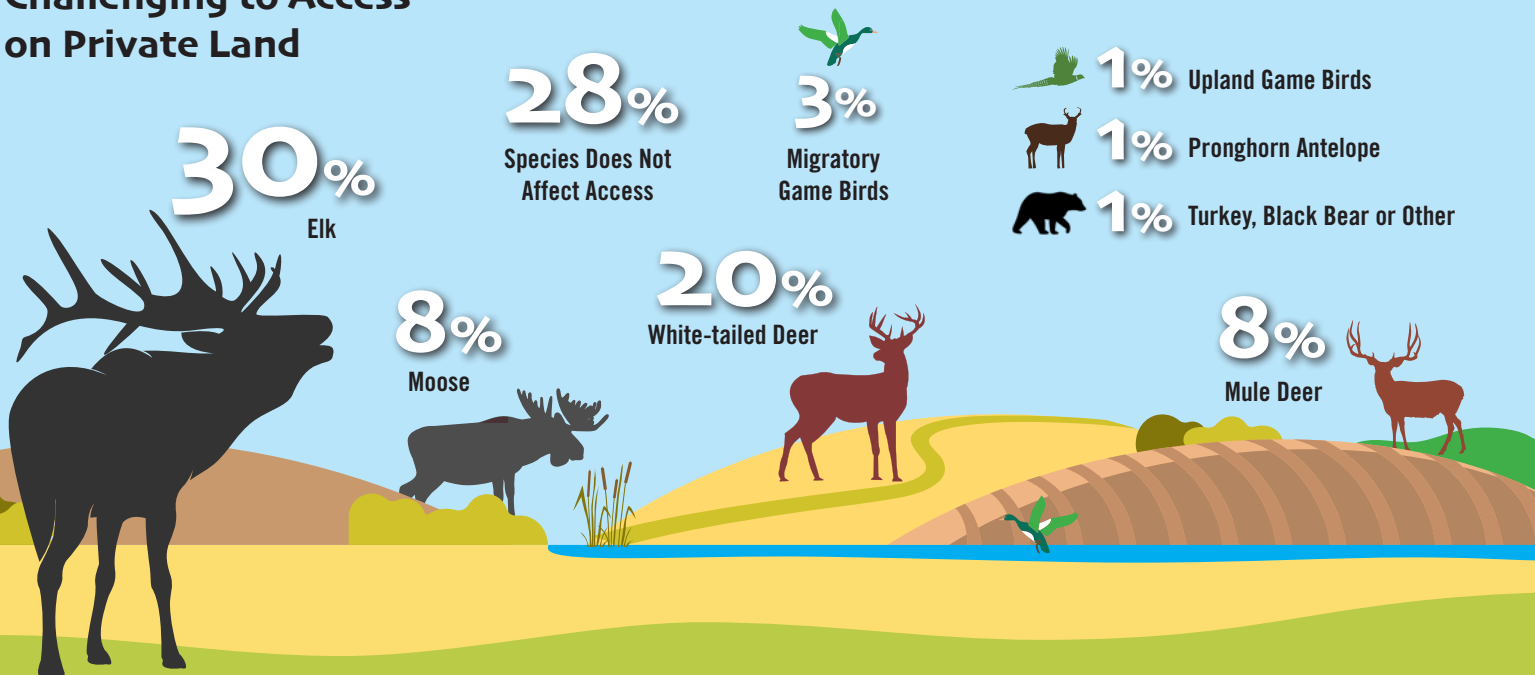


Factors Keeping Hunters from Hunting

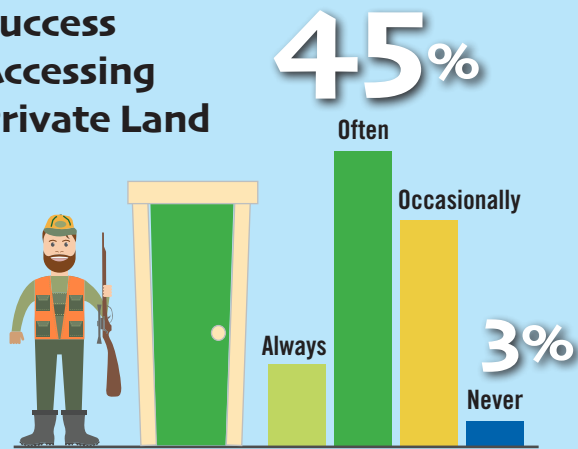

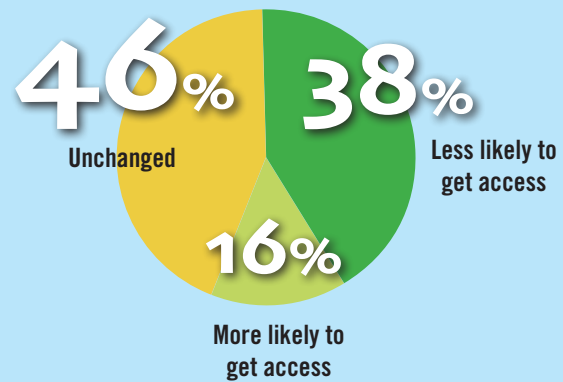
Game Found Most Challenging to Access on Private Land



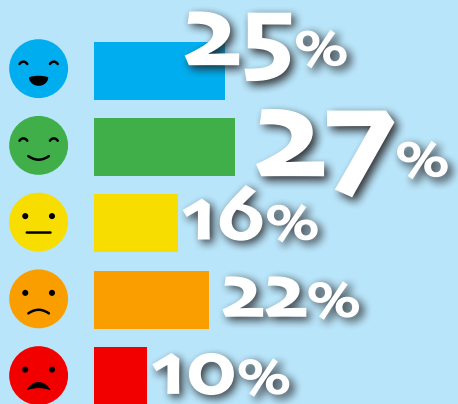
Success Accessing Private Land
